This edition of speeches, writings and orders makes it possible for professional historians and the interested public to access all of Hitler's surviving pronouncements from the reformation of the Nazi Party in February 1925 to its seizure of power on 30th January 1933. It fills a glaring gap in this area of research: no systematic record of the surviving evidence of Hitler's activities as speaker, party leader and politician having yet been published. It is precisely this period, however, which was decisively marked by the rise of the Nazi Party, the development of Hitler's personal role as leader of the Nazi movement and the Hitler-led struggle for political power within the German Reich.

Hitler's speeches up to 1933 provide the main focus of this edition. They represent by far the Nazi movement's most effective means of propaganda. The speeches demonstrate Hitler's worldview and political aims and reflect aspects of change and continuity in the Nazi propaganda machine. Since successful propaganda is always a question of mutual communication, the speeches are also a source of information on their addressees, revealing the political, social and ideological expectations prevalent in the German Reich.

Hitler's internal party instructions and writings, also included here, cover everything from fundamental political guidelines and organisational directives to letters to Chancellor Brüning and President von Hindenburg. The edition also includes Hitler's manifestos, appeals, articles and essays.

Volume IIA provides an essential complement to this edition. Hitler's foreign ambitions – summarized in a complete book manuscript never published during the Third Reich – have here been comprehensively documented and annotated. These writings from the late spring of 1928 are essential for an understanding of Hitler's personality and ideology during the struggle for power in Germany and of his later policy as Chancellor.

The underlying purpose of this academic edition is to provide the fullest possible documentation. By bringing in all themes, this edition allows researchers to single out for study any aspect of Hitler's world view, its gradual development and inner system. It is the result of several years of intense research by the Institut für

Zeitgeschichte in German, the former GDR, Austrian and Polish archives and a comprehensive analysis of the often hard-to-trace reports in the local and regional press on Hitler's appearances as a speaker.

In-depth commentary reveals the highly subtle mechanisms of Hitler's propaganda and puts events in a historical context, meticulously reconstructed in individual analyses'. Each volume includes an index of persons containing biographical details.

Volume VI, the index volume, offers an ideal basis for accessing the material in volumes I-V, cumulating the indexes of the individual volumes. In addition, an index of places and an extensive subject index have been included. Through the thorough keyword and subject heading indexes all annotations and documents are easily found. The appendix contains maps and addenda with their/its own index.

This edition not only builds upon the achievements of biographical research on Hitler, it also represents an essential source for those studying the history of the Nazi Party during the Weimar Republic.

The supplement, **Ergänzungsband: Der Hitler-Prozess 1924**, includes the complete transcript of the main proceedings against Hitler and his comrades in unabridged form, including comprehensive notes and containing both a detailed introduction of the historical situation, which led to the coup and to the trial and a judicial history of the People's Courts. It presents many documents, thoroughly prepared and annotated, which were previously scattered and difficult to access. The typewritten transcripts of the trial proceedings against Hitler and his co-defendants in the People's Court 1 Munich serve as the basis for this edition. They amount to 2,918 pages covering all 24 days of the trial between 26th February and 27th March and also 1st April 1924, the day on which verdict was pronounced. In addition, further files and the relatively detailed newspaper reports of the time are used. The transcript is supplemented by biographical notes and an index of persons. This edition covers the judicial errors and resulting political scandal which allowed Adolf Hitler and the NSDAP's unhindered rise to power. It is a valuable primary source for research and teaching, providing considerable assistance in dealing with this trial of the century.

In 1992, in a Moscow special archive, Elke Fröhlich discovered the glass plate copies of Joseph Goebbels' diaries. During the closing phase of the Second World War Goebbels himself had ordered that copies of all his diaries be preserved for posterity, using a forerunner of the modern microfiche filming technique. Thanks to its completeness, this sensational find promises to open up entirely new research perspectives.

Thus, **Part I** of the diaries covering the period before 1933 offers highly interesting new insights into the psyche and character of its writer and into the early history of the NSDAP, political developments leading to the seizure of power by the National Socialists in 1933 and the brutal manner in which they ruled.

The **Part II**, Diktate 1941-1945, contains the typewritten parts of the diaries. All diary entries are published in full and in the final, amended version – including the military status report preceding each entry. Every entry is headed by a document summary listing the material on which the edition is based and briefly describing the record itself.

In all the complete edition of the diaries comprises about 98% of the material written or dictated by Goebbels himself. Every volume has both an index of persons and a geographical index. This edition of the diaries of Hitler's minister of propaganda, the **Tagebücher von Joseph Goebbels**, is unique in its value as a source, representing the only testimony written by one of the leading National Socialist politicians himself over a period of more than two decades.
